

Learning objective: to spell contractions using apostrophes.

Sometimes two words can be squished together, or **contracted**, into one word using an **apostrophe** (') which looks like a comma (,) hanging in the air. In a contraction, the apostrophe shows where a letter or letters have **been taken out**.

Tip: Apostrophes can also be used to show possession... but are **never** used to indicate plurals!
